Neuropathic Pain

Do you have burning foot and/or leg pain? If it feels like an insect is biting into your flesh or the pain feels like thousands of needles pricking you, chances are you have neuropathic pain due to nerve terminal damage from a disease like diabetes. In Spinal Intervention, we specialize in treating this type of pain.



Post-Herpes Neuralgia Pain

If you have ever had shingles and now struggle with a burning pain in your skin, you may have a condition called post-herpes neuralgia. This is one of the most painful conditions a person can experience. It can feel like a burning knife cutting through your skin, but we can help.



Pain after Back or Neck Surgery

Patients still experiencing pain after back or neck surgery may have failed back or failed neck syndrome. This pain is severe, consistent, and non-relenting. It also is unlikely to respond to medical management or even high dosages of narcotics. Spinal Intervention can help with minimally invasive treatment.



Vascular Pain

Do you have peripheral vascular pain? Drastically reduced blood supply to your arms or legs may result in a severe gnawing pain in your hands or feet. Peripheral vascular pain usually does not respond to pain medication, but we offer minimally invasive procedures that may be just what you need.



Complex Regional Pain Syndrome/Causalgia

Complex regional pain syndrome can occur after a trauma or injury to your arm or leg. If your hand/arm or foot/leg swell, turn red or purplish, and exhibit severe burning pain, causalgia may be the issue. This extremely disagreeable pain can be quickly treated with minor injections or minimally invasive procedures. In many cases, the worse the pain, the better the response to treatment.



Refractory Pain

If you're experiencing pain that you can't control with treatment and there's no diagnosis to explain it, please visit Spinal Intervention. We may have a clue as to what's causing the pain or even an answer. Only after a proper diagnosis can we begin to properly treat your pain.
